More than \$2 Billion for Open Space Approved by Voters in Chicago Suburbs

Since 1993, voters in the Chicago collar counties have approved 47 out of 51 open space conservation ballot measures totaling more than \$2 billion. All county-wide referenda have passed. This money has helped protect more than 40,000 acres of land in Northeastern Illinois. Those marked with an asterisks (*) are campaigns The Conservation Foundation either managed (14) or acted as consultant (7).
